



Announcement of the National Institute of Development Administration
on Scholarship Type 1 (Full Scholarship) Awarded to International Students

For the purpose of fair fund distribution, and based upon the authority provided in Chapter 7, Clause 36 on financial aids stipulated by the Statute of the National Institute of Development Administration on Scholarships and Financial Aid (No. 2) B.E. 2551 (2008 A.D.) as well as the resolution of Dean/Director Meeting no. 11/2010 dated 17 November 2010, the National Institute of Development Administration thereby allocates the scholarship type 1 (full scholarship) to international students at the master's and doctoral levels in the academic year 2011 as follows.

2. Award Amount

Scholarship recipients shall be given exception from tuition fees throughout the entire program. Monthly allowance of 10,000 baht shall be also awarded to each recipient. Health insurance is not included. [Extra-curricular](#) activity fees are left to the discretion of each program/school.

3. Qualifications of Scholarship Applicants

- 3.1 To apply for the doctoral scholarship, the recipient must have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 out of a possible 4.0 for the Bachelor's degree and 3.5 for the Master's.
- 3.2 To apply for the Master's scholarship, the recipient must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 for the Bachelor's degree.

4. Terms and Conditions for Scholarship Recipients

- 4.1 Recipients must maintain a 3.50 cumulative GPA for each semester to determine their eligibility for continued funding. Failures to meet the GPA requirement in any semester result in automatic forfeiture of the remainder of the scholarship.
- 4.2 Copyrights in theses shall be jointly owned by the student and the Institute for a period of 5 years.
- 4.3 Recipients at the Master's level must choose to study in Plan A. (Thesis Track).
- 4.4 Recipients who interrupt their studies will be immediately ineligible for their scholarships. Further, upon their withdrawal from the program or their request for scholarship cancellation, recipients must refund the scholarship amounts in full to the Institute, except that the Committee figures something else out.
- 4.5 The thesis must be published or at least the thesis-based paper or any part thereof must be accepted by and published in high-prestige and peer-reviewed journals at the national or international level. These journals must be widely recognized in the field.
- 4.6 Recipients have no rights to apply for any other scholarships provided by the Institute, except for the "state budget" financial aid supporting their research conduct and publication.

5. In cases of necessity and appropriateness, the Scholarship and Financial Aid Committee may consider exceptional cases in terms of applicants' qualifications as well as terms and conditions, and decide on a case by case basis.

6. Standard Duration of Scholarship (counting from the first day the scholarship recipient is registered as a student)

- 6.1 Master's Degree Program: The award period will be 2 years.
- 6.2 Ph.D. Program: The award period will be 3 years.
- 6.3 Joint Master's/ Ph.D. Program: The award period will be 4 years.
